

Is My Respect in Sport - Parent Certification Valid?

2021-2022 Season


IMPORTANT FOR 2021-2022 SEASON ONLY: Hockey Alberta granted a one year extension for all certifications that were valid on May 1, 2021. However, this extension is not noted in the Respect in Sport account but rather only shows in the Hockey Canada Registry (HCR) 3.0. The expiry date in the HCR 3.0 system overrides what is shown in the Respect in Sport account.

If you have previously completed the Respect in Sport – Parent program and are unsure if it is still valid, you can check one of two ways:

1. <u>Hockey Canada Registry 3.0 Spordle</u>: *preferred method for 2021-2022 season due to Hockey Alberta's extension of valid Respect in Sport certifications as of May 1, 2021


If you have not done so already, you will need to create an account for the new HCR 3.0 system. Instructions on why this is the case and how to do this can be found by reviewing this document: Create a new HCR 3.0 Spordle Account & Link Self and Family Members.


Once you have created an account and linked your members, log in and click "Members" on the left-hand side menu.

Click on the initials of the player you want to verify Respect in Sport – Parent has been attached to. If you have multiple players registering, please verify this information for each player.





You should see Respect in Sport – Parent listed with the season the certification was taken in and the validity period. The validity period must end after 2022-05-01.

If validity ends prior to May 1, 2022, you will need to re-certify the Respect in Sport-Parent for the 2021-2022 season.


Note: if you have taken the course more than once, you will see this qualification listed multiple times so please make sure to check for the most recently completed one.

2. <u>Respect in Sport website</u>: Login to your profile and on the home page, look at the top right-hand corner under your account name for program status and expiry date.

If program status shows CERTIFIED, you are fine and do not need to re-certify. If it shows EXPIRED you may need to re-certify. Verify the expiry date is May 1, 2022 or later. If it shows a date prior to May 1, 2021, you will need to re-certify. If it shows May 1, 2021, the Hockey Alberta one year extension should have applied and you should be fine for the 2021-2022 season as the expiry of your Respect in Sport-Parent certification should show as May 1, 2022 in your player(s) profile on the Hockey Canada Registry 3.0. (see above for further information on that).
